

Civil Registration System National Sample Survey and Local Body Statistics
(CNL Division)

I. Civil Registration system

The Registration of Births & Deaths (RRB) Act, 1969 come into force in the state with effect from 1st April 1970. The Karnataka Registration of Births & Deaths(KRBD) Rules, 1970 were framed and notified by the Government of Karnataka on 15th Dec 1970 and were effective from 1st January 1971. KRBD rules subsequently were amended in December 1999, as per the instructions of Registrar General, India. Revamped system of Registration of Births & Deaths is in force in Karnataka from 1st January 2000.

1. Web-based Birth and Death Registration – e-JanMa

In order to simplify the registration procedure, web-based application for the registration of Birth, Death and Still Birth events has been developed by the DES in association with NIC it has been named as e-JanMa (i.e., electronic – Janana Marana). The e-JanMa application has been implemented in rural part in phased manner from 1st August 2014 and subsequently rolled out in BBMP from 01.04.2018 and in urban local bodies from 2.07.2018 in Karnataka.

Registrars digitally sign the certificates. Certificates will be issued in the Attalji Janasnehi Kendra for the events which are occurred in rural area and for the events which are occurred in urban area in their respective Birth & Death registration Centers.

Report on the working of Registration of births and deaths Act, 1969 will be prepared every year based on the statistical information

2. Medial Certification Of Cause Of Death(MCCD)

Under the System of Registration of Births and Deaths Act ,1969 the Scheme of Medical Certification of Cause of Death form an integral part of the Vital Statistics System which aims at providing a reliable database for generating cause specific mortality statistics on a regular basis .The scheme of MCCD was introduced in the state during the year 1967.The certificate of cause(s) of death certified by the doctors were sent in the Prescribed form (No.4)directly from the

institutions covered under the scheme of MCCD on a monthly basis to Chief Registrar of Births and Deaths office. They were Scrutinised and coded as per ICD.10th Revision and Table-9 derived as per the National list Prescribed/Designed by the Registered General, India.

II. National Sample Survey (NSS):

1. Karnataka started collaborating with the NSSO since 18th round (1963-64)
2. Samples covered in each round in an equal matching basis
3. 77th round NSS field work is in progress (duration of the survey in Jan-Dec2019)
4. From 66th round onwards DES is Pooling both Central and State unit level data and bringing out the district level estimate.
5. DES has published 66th, 67th, 68th, 69th and 71st rounds Pooled data.

III. Representation of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in State Civil

Services:

As per the Government order No. DPAR 11 SBC 89 Bangalore Dated 6th May, 1989, the statistical information relating to the representation of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in the State Civil Services is being collected from all the Government Departments as on 31st March of every year. Annual statistical report relating to representation of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes in the State Civil Services will be prepared.
